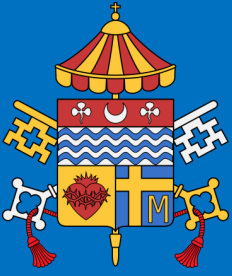

SUNDAY REFLECTION

Jesus speaks through the prophet Isaiah in today's First Reading.

He tells us of the mission given to Him by the Father from the womb: "You are My servant," He said to Me."

Servant and Son, our Lord was sent to lead a new exodus—to raise up the exiled tribes of Israel, to gather and restore them to God. More than that, He was to be a light to the nations,

that God's salvation may reach to the ends of the earth (see [Acts 13:46–47](#)).

Before the first exodus, a lamb was offered in sacrifice and its blood painted on the Israelites' door posts. The blood of the lamb identified their homes and the Lord "passed over" these in executing judgment on the Egyptians (see [Exodus 12:1–23, 27](#)).

In the new exodus, Jesus is the "Lamb of God," as John beholds Him in the Gospel today (see [1 Corinthians 5:7](#); [1 Peter 1:18–19](#)). Our Lord sings of this in today's Psalm. He has come, He says, to offer His body to do the will of God (see [Hebrews 10:3–13](#)).

The sacrifices, oblations, holocausts, and sin-offerings given after the first exodus had no power to take away sins (see [Hebrews 10:4](#)). They were meant not to save but to teach (see [Galatians 3:24](#)). In offering these sacrifices, the people were to learn self-sacrifice—that they were made for worship, to offer themselves freely to God and to delight in His will.

Only Jesus could make that perfect offering of Himself. And through His sacrifice, He has given us ears open to obedience and made it possible for us to hear the Father's call to holiness, as Paul says in today's Epistle.

He has made us children of God, baptized in the blood of the Lamb (see [Revelation 7:14](#)). And we are to join our sacrifice to His, to offer our bodies—our lives—as living sacrifices in the spiritual worship of the Mass (see [Romans 12:1](#)).

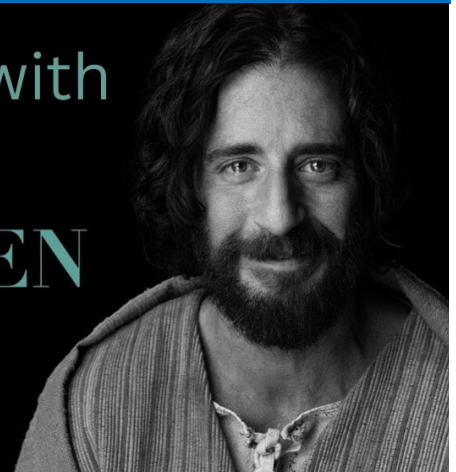

REFLEXION DOMINICAL

Jesús habla a través del profeta Isaías en la Primera Lectura de hoy.

Nos habla de la misión que le encomendó el Padre desde el seno materno: "Mi siervo eres tú, me dijo".

Siervo e Hijo, nuestro Señor fue enviado para liderar un nuevo éxodo: para levantar a las tribus exiliadas de Israel, para reunir las y restaurarlas para Dios. Más que eso, debía ser una luz para las naciones, para que la salvación de Dios llegara hasta los confines de la tierra (véase Hechos 13:46-47).

Antes del primer éxodo, se ofrecía un cordero en sacrificio y su sangre se pintaba en los postes de las puertas de los israelitas. La sangre del cordero identificó sus hogares y el Señor los "pasó por alto" al ejecutar el juicio sobre los egipcios (véase Éxodo 12:1-23, 27).

En el nuevo éxodo, Jesús es el "Cordero de Dios", como lo contempla Juan en el Evangelio de hoy (ver 1 Corintios 5:7; 1 Pedro 1:18-19). Nuestro Señor canta esto en el Salmo de hoy. Ha venido, dice, a ofrecer Su cuerpo para hacer la voluntad de Dios (véase Hebreos 10:3-13).

Los sacrificios, oblações, holocaustos y ofrendas por el pecado dados después del primer éxodo no tenían poder para quitar los pecados (ver Hebreos 10:4). No estaban destinados a salvar sino a enseñar (ver Gálatas 3:24). Al ofrecer estos sacrificios, el pueblo debía aprender el sacrificio propio, que fueron hechos para la adoración, para ofrecerse libremente a Dios y para deleitarse en Su voluntad.

Solo Jesús podía hacer esa ofrenda perfecta de sí mismo. Y a través de su sacrificio, nos ha abierto los oídos a la obediencia y nos ha hecho posible escuchar el llamado del Padre a la santidad, como dice Pablo en la epístola de hoy.

Él nos ha hecho hijos de Dios, bautizados en la sangre del Cordero (ver Apocalipsis 7:14). Y debemos unir nuestro sacrificio al Suyo, para ofrecer nuestros cuerpos, nuestras vidas, como sacrificios vivos en el culto espiritual de la Misa (ver Romanos 12:1).

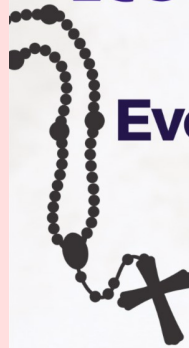
